I love seeing the kids and youth get involved and share their gifts with us, and how the older generation is so supportive of them. I'm excited for the opportunities we have to reach out to the people of Toowong through ministries like English Conversation, Morning Tea Under the Umbrellas and Playgroup. I'm encouraged by all that God is doing through Uni Ministry and the Pastorates and how friendships and chances to disciple one another are cropping up all over the place. I'm overwhelmed by the love I see people sharing with one another as we do life together here.

But this is not the end of our story. This love, God's love, that we see expressed here at TUC, wants to go further. Let's take it out into the community, to the people of Toowong, to help more people know Jesus and be transformed by him.

We can't know exactly what the future will look like and what changes will occur. Afterall, could the TUC of the past have known that this is where they would be in 2019? But we do know that the Spirit will guide us and that God goes ahead of us. As we look to our future and the next steps that we are to take as Toowong Uniting Church, let's remember where we came from and build on the past. We are a people whose God will never leave us or forsake us. He has something far better planned than anything we could think up, so let's let Him take us where He wants us to go. And how wonderful that we get to do this together, with Him and with each other.

Children's & Youth Ministry

KATS (Toddlers - Year 5)

KATS stands for Kids at Toowong on Sunday and is our Sunday morning children's program run during the school term. The children leave after the children's talk to gather in their **Tiger, Leopard and Lion age groups.** An enthusiastic group of volunteers lead these groups, teaching the children about God in a fun and friendly environment.

Junior Youth (years 6 - 8)

Junior Youth also gather on Sunday mornings after the children's talk in the church house for a time of bible study and fun activities. The Scripture Union Light curriculum is used for KATS and Junior Youth. Each session encourages the children to get to know God better through praying together, looking at the bible together and themed games and craft.

Senior Youth (years 9 - 12)

Senior Youth join in with the whole Sunday worship and are encouraged to take on leadership roles in the church. Senior Youth also meet together every second Saturday night during the school term for Youth Group. **Our remaining dates for Senior Youth in term 2 are: 11 May, 25 May, 8 June and 22 June.**



Earth Overshoot Day Caring for Our Environment

Caring for the planet and fixing our damaged relationship with the environment is something I'm passionate about and plan to pursue as a career, so I found it very worrying to discover that this years' Earth Overshoot Day was the earliest yet, the 29th of July. Earth Overshoot Day marks the date when humanity's demand for ecological resources and services in a given year exceeds what Earth can regenerate in that year. Ecological resources and services can be things like forest land, crude oil, fish stocks, and the planet's ability to take care of excess waste or emissions. So since the start of this year, we've used up the amount of natural resources it takes the planet a year to regenerate. That's 12 months of resources used in only 7 months. It is especially worrying to consider that if everyone in the world lived like we do in

Australia, we would use a year's worth of resources by the 31st of March. Given that we discussed the story of the prodigal son at Senior Youth camp this year, I find myself comparing our actions as humans, particularly as the relatively well-off humans we are in Australia, to the story of the prodigal son. We are taking Earths' resources, God's creation, and squandering them at such an alarming rate, that we will be left destitute soon enough if we don't take action to change. As the story of the prodigal son teaches, God will always welcome us back with loving arms – but unfortunately for us, there won't be much we can do to get our planet back. Last year, the United Nations predicted that radical change needs to occur in the next 12 years in order to prevent devastating environmental destruction. This change would require the commitment of every person, every organisation and every government on the entire planet. It's encouraging to learn we already have the technology to transition to a clean energy future. Jesus also encourages us to rediscover a life consisting of far more than the accumulation of possessions (fight against consumerism, in modern terms) in Luke 12:15:

Then he said to them, "Watch out! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; life does not consist in an abundance of possessions." (NIV)

As custodians of creation I believe it is our responsibility to do what we can to move Earth Overshoot Day to a later date. I encourage everyone to look for ways to make change in their personal lives, as well as making our governments more aware of the pressing need for adequate climate and environmental policy.
