

Welcome!

Whenever we use the term 'mission' it can carry a multiplicity of meanings – positive and negative. 'Mission' may generate some excitement for you at the thought of participating with the Holy Spirit, getting involved in what God is already doing, possibly going somewhere and being used for God's purpose. Alternatively, this word could also bring to mind unease at the idea of being called on to give up your precious time and resources, be drawn out of your comfort zone and to face challenges that most people would reasonably decline. You may have both reactions at the same time! And what does that word 'mission' even mean for us in our context and time?



Many people of course know about the chaplain who was appointed to the First Fleet in 1788, Richard Johnson. Johnson famously gave the first sermon in Australia, (mandatory attendance for all convicts and soldiers) on Psalm 116 "what shall I render unto the Lord for all His benefits unto me?" Some of those convicts may well have wondered when these benefits would start to appear!


Accompanying Johnson was his new bride of only eight months, Mary Johnson, who was the only officer's wife on board the fleet of 11 ships. A letter Mary wrote back to England describes the struggles of living in the settlement, but also mentions her strong sense that this was the place that the Lord had called her to, so the hardships and absence of luxuries became bearable. In May 1789, a young Aboriginal girl named Boorong was brought to the Johnson's home after surviving smallpox. Mary took on the role of foster mother, tutoring Boorong in English, and learning from Boorong about local Eora culture. Boorong stayed with the Johnson's of her own free will for 18 months, before returning to her people. Mary and Boorong are believed to have engaged in the earliest recorded female cross-cultural relationship in Australian history. In 1790, Mary gave birth to a daughter, and named her Milbah, an Eora nation name. Milbah is the first recorded case of a European giving their child a First Nation name.

Mary's life showed a willingness to engage with different people, and that required from her a commitment to travel beyond what was familiar, to embrace uncertainties, and to fully enter life where she was - on its own terms. Mary was 'on mission' as she left the safe and predictable for an extraordinary life in a different time and place. One thing is for sure, Mary Johnson's journey transformed her into a different woman to whom she would have been, had she just remained in England.

For us, we are called to follow Jesus where ever he would lead us. His call asks for our willingness to engage with those unfamiliar and to embrace the uncertainties that difference creates. The word mission (in Latin 'missio') is translated from the Greek word 'apostle' which means a 'sent one' with a special purpose. TUC's mission is to share the Light of Christ with all the world. Good news people - the world has turned up in Toowong! We're excited to see what God wants to do and we'll be transformed by the journey with Jesus.

The Light of Christ for all the World

'The Light of Christ' is one of those phrases that pops up regularly and it's no surprise that it forms our TUC mission statement.

In part, the phrase has its origins in the words of Jesus recorded in John 8: "I am the light of the World. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness but have the light of life". This was the second of Jesus' "I am" statements recorded in John's gospel, and as so often was the case, seemed to upset a group of pharisees and cause an argument.

We can also find echoes in Jesus' Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5) as Jesus offers the observation "You are the light of the world" and the explanation that follows about "letting your light shine before others, that they might see (your) good deeds and glorify your Father in Heaven".

Those are just a couple of the many examples from scripture. Do a little searching and see what you find.

I think we do intuitively know what this phrase the "Light of Christ for all the World" means. It's deeply embedded in our lives and understanding as followers of Christ. Its meaning is pretty plain to us.

Christ is the light. We point to, or reveal, or show that light. That's our task. That, in a sense, is the very definition of mission. Our purpose as Christians is to both live in the light of Christ, and to point to it for others.

Living in the light of Christ opens us up, each of us, to clarity, to possibility, to hope. The light illuminates dark and hidden places so that we can be renewed or restored. It helps us move beyond darkness, and lostness and despair. Light is love. That's a gift we think is important to share with others.

It also turns out that pointing to the Light of Christ is not only about words, but actions too. What we do, the way we live as followers of Christ reveals the light.

Australian missiologist Michael Frost writes about mission as being the "demonstration and declaration of the reign of God through Christ". Our own Uniting Church Basis of Union notes that the purpose of our church is to be an "instrument through which Christ may work and bear witness to himself".

Declare and demonstrate, work and bear witness.

These are the twin tasks our church is called to, the twin aspects of life that we are committing to in this mission statement. In our own lives. and by invitation in the lives of our neighbours.

We 'know' what it means to be, or to reveal the light of Christ. The challenge is to actually live it out for real. Let's go on the journey together.

Children's & Youth Ministry

KATS (Toddlers - Year 5)

KATS stands for Kids at Toowong on Sunday and is our Sunday morning children's program run during the school term. The children leave after the children's talk to gather in their **Tiger, Leopard and Lion age groups.** An enthusiastic group of volunteers lead these groups, teaching the children about God in a fun and friendly environment.

Junior Youth (years 6 - 8)

Junior Youth also gather on Sunday mornings after the children's talk for a time of bible study and fun activities. The Scripture Union Light curriculum is used for KATS and Junior Youth. Each session encourages the children to get to know God better through praying together, looking at the bible together and themed games and craft.

Senior Youth (years 9 - 12)

Senior Youth join in with the whole Sunday worship and are encouraged to take on leadership roles in the church. Senior Youth also meet together every second Friday night during the school term for Youth Group.

Children's & Youth Events

A number of events are run during the year, such as the Junior Youth Sleepover, the Moonwalk and the Light Party. Keep checking the newsletter and enews for updates about these events.

Safe Ministry with Children

TUC has adopted the Uniting Church in Australia Queensland Synod's Safe Ministry with Children policy and believes that every person is precious to God and in following Jesus' example, we are committed to providing a safe church for all, particularly those who are vulnerable.

All volunteers working with children at TUC have up-todate Blue Cards and have completed the Safe Ministry with Children training.

KATS & Junior Youth Dates



We are really excited to be starting The Prayer Course at TUC! This eight week course is run by the 24-7 Prayer group, and you can find all the resources you will need to run the course in your small group on the website above.

That's right, instead of just running this course from one location at TUC, we are asking you to start up small groups in your homes and lead the course yourselves. We think this will be a great opportunity to all be working through this course together as we grow deeper in our praying relationship with God and strengthen relationships with one another.

Here's what to do:

1. Let us know if you would like to lead a small group.

You can invite whoever you like to your group, and keep it as big or small as you like. Why not even invite friends and family from outside TUC to come along? You can choose when you meet with your group over the 8 weeks e.g. maybe every Sunday afternoon, or maybe on a weeknight, whatever suits you and your group best. You could choose to meet always in your home, or in a different home each time. You could also run each week's session on Zoom. Each session goes for an hour, and the website has all the videos, discussion questions and ideas for how to run each session - just follow along.
