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### **Minister's Letter**

### Welcome!

Before its closure in 1998, arriving at the old Hong Kong international airport was one of the 'white knuckles' air travel experiences of the past. (I never flew it, but I recall my father's account of the harrowing flight). Due to the position of the runway alongside the centre of the city, incoming jetliners had to approach on a collision course to the high rise area and then bank hard right at the last moment to line up with the runway. Passengers to Hong Kong could literally see into the apartments of nearby residents, and my father was convinced that the plane he was on was going to wing scrape the perilously close buildings. Pilots called it the 'heart attack approach' because they had to take manual control, and it wasn't uncommon for passengers to kiss the tarmac after disembarking.

airports around the globe. Passengers needed to trust the person in charge of their journey, despite their eyes and senses telling them that everything was at imminent risk of disaster.


Our theme for March is "Promised", taking notice how the life journey of Abraham and Sarah required them to constantly trust the promise of God for their life, even when their circumstances were telling them that nothing promised by God was going to plan. What was hoped for seemed to be unfulfilled, God's timeline seemed unlikely and the obstacles were overwhelming. Abraham had every reason to let his better judgement convince him to put his feet up and enjoy a quiet retirement. Yet that wonderful verse in Genesis 15: 6 records this critical point of history changing faith - "Abram believed the LORD, and he credited it to him as righteousness".

Where there are promises from God for us living in the covenant of grace, we should be willing to take God's word as a reassurance that what is promised will be fulfilled. Abraham and Sarah's story reveals that God wanted to enter a promise relationship with this man and woman who seemed unlikely candidates for being the god-parents of three world faiths. God made extraordinary promises to them, which history has shown continue to be proved true.

Right now, today, you and I live in the promise of God. Can we believe that? In this time and place, despite what appears to be happening outside our windows?

### What happens at Children's Ministry?

- Children are encouraged to get to know God and to talk to Him
- Children grow in confidence to read and learn about God's word for themselves
- To help them do this, high-quality, approved, curriculum-based material has been chosen
- Teachers are passionate about sharing God's love with young people in a caring and supportive environment
- Children learn in a creative, thoughtful and play-based session

### How can you as a parent or carer, help your child enjoy this time?

- Come as often as you can so that your child has continuity, knows what to expect and most important of all can make great friends!
- Ask them about what they learn and what they have experienced
- Lean on God to help you:
- **Talk to God together** A suggestion would be to pray with your child at bedtime after their bedtime story.
- **Celebrate** Enjoy time together and thank God for it.
- **Read the Bible together** read a Children's Bible story each night as part of the night time routine or together as a family.
- Grow with your children all these things are easier when your child is small but I urge you to continue these things throughout their lives; see them as not just a child's routine but as your routine. Your children will learn from you, as they mature into teenage and then adulthood, that friendship with God is a lifelong adventure.

### Why 'Sunday School'?

Did you know that Sunday Schools were started in the UK in 1700s to help working children get an education and this included teaching a knowledge of the Bible? The movement grew until 1870 when the Education Act provided universal education to primary school children.

Today, the term Sunday School has been largely dropped to move from the school image to one of ministry. Terms such as Kid's Church or Children's Ministry are now used.


